

PARTS CLEANER MIXED WITH USED OIL

Requirements and Log

MIXING WASTES WITH USED OIL:

Mixing any wastes with your used oil is **NOT** allowed, except: (*ONLY TWO EXCEPTIONS*)

1. Used fuel filters from vehicles or fuel distribution or dispensing systems may be managed with your used oil filters.
2. **Very Small Quantity Generators (VSQGs) ONLY** may mix certain petroleum-based waste solvents into your used oil before burning on site or shipping it off site as used oil, provided you meet the following conditions:
 - The solvent is petroleum-based and meets all the following criteria:
 - ✓ Has a flash point greater than 100 degrees Fahrenheit,
 - ✓ Is **NOT** contaminated with a chlorinated solvent, such as a perchloroethylene, trichloroethylene, or methylene chloride,
 - ✓ Is **NOT** a paint-related waste containing a concentration of hazardous metal pigment, such as lead, cadmium, and chromium, above the Toxicity Characteristic Leaching Procedure Limits,
 - The mixture contains a maximum of 10% solvent waste to 90% used oil. At no time can the mixture exceed 10% solvent.
 - Only your employees mix your waste into your containers or tanks. Transport or disposal vendors may not mix your hazardous waste into used oil on their vehicles or at their site.
 - You **keep records of each mixing event** for at least three year from the mixing date.

MORE INFORMATION:

Used oil and related wastes that are improperly managed may release toxic contaminants or heavy metals into the environment. Groundwater and drinking water sources are particularly at risk for pollution from improperly managed used oil. Used oil and oil related waste regulations and compliance guidance can be found at:
